Inn Churches Night Shelter Wilsden 26th– 31st December

For the fourth year in a row, St. Matthew's will be hosting a night shelter for the homeless between Christmas and New Year. The project began as part of St. Matthew's outreach to the community, but from the beginning it has had enormous support from church members in all four villages. This is an excellent example of the way in which the benefice can work together to further our Christian calling to care for others.

The project is labour intensive, with twenty volunteer slots to be filled for each of the five nights. We need cleaners, catering teams for breakfast and dinner, greeting teams for the evenings and especially volunteers to stay and care for our guests overnight.
